

Absolutely spectacular. Despite it's name, this covers just about everything, including stuff you'll never see, much less try to keep in an aquarium. This is great for zoology-oriented kids, pet shop keepers, zoology lab staff, you name it. If I were a professional herpetologist, I'd have a copy, too. It's that comprehensive. The only sort-of fault it has is that it's not updated all the time, so some subspecies and such have been taxonomically reclassified since this was published. But the vast majority of it is accurate and will be for a long time.

I had this volume years ago when it was first printed and loved it. I kept a number of reptiles, at the time, and found this to be a valuable resource. I gave it to a friend, long ago, and, recently, felt I needed to include it in my library. The copy I ordered had minor spine damage but does not detract from the overall usefulness. It's, by no means, all encompassing, but it successfully covers the familiar and unfamiliar reptiles and amphibians one might encounter at local herp shows (the venomous critters, not so much). It's a hefty volume, with hundreds of beautiful photographic representations, not often seen at a reasonable price. Highly recommended for any herp nut.
