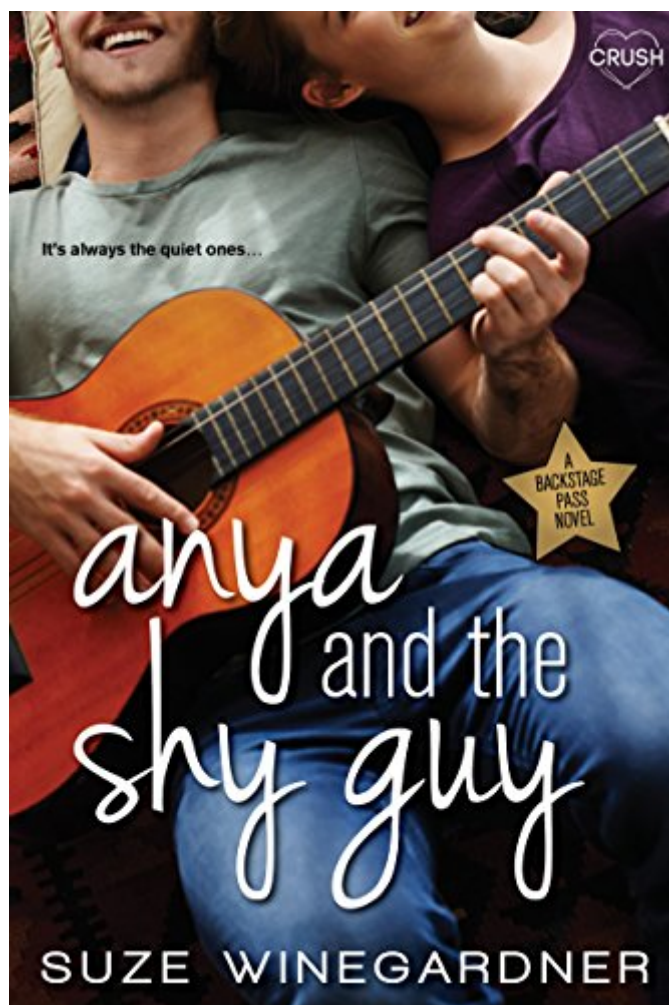


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Anya And The Shy Guy (Backstage Pass)

I love a twin-switch story. I love rock stars. I love Suze Winegardner. Basically, only one thing gave me pause. I don't read a lot of YA. Would I love a Teen Crush? Should I risk it? I thought the genre was the only risk involved, but there is a hidden risk I didn't fully appreciate when I decided to hit "Buy." I'll get to that later. Anyway, I took the risk and I'm glad I did! Anya and Will have their secrets, and good reasons for keeping them. They're both shouldering more responsibilities than teenagers should have to bear. Their backstories had me rooting for them as individuals--which puts the reader in a tough position because this is one of those situations where if one succeeds, the other fails--but it's not an enemies-to-lovers story. The genuine affection and attraction between Anya and Will make their interactions fun and...well...adorable. The connection feels real and it's really them against their circumstances, not each other. Still, they are difficult circumstances, and I definitely had the "Oh NO!" moments when I wondered how the heck these two were going to find a legit happily-ever-after. Yet they do. One I completely bought into and absolutely loved. Okay, now for the hidden risk in reading this book. It's the 4th in the 5 book Backstage Pass series, and once you read it, you're going to want to buy the others. Have your book budget ready!

Now we've reached the fourth book in the series and my personal favorite. For some reason, it really bugs me when the main character doesn't know the real name of the love interest or vice versa. Mistaken identity in YA stories just isn't my thing. Surprisingly enough, the author of this book actually pulled this off in a completely unique way. I've never read a story that had this sort of plot and that alone was refreshing enough for me. Yes, it had tons of drama as usual, but I think you can already tell that this is something you can instantly expect in these books. Anya was a great character and her story was actually a lot more serious and depressing than the previous three leading ladies. She was a very driven girl with a past history of homelessness that honestly broke my heart. You don't typically see a lot of this in YA so I thought that was a wise move to make. As for Matt, I found him to be insanely charming and I loved him with Anya. He had a pressing secret that he simply couldn't let Anya figure out. I thought it said a lot about him that he was able to stick up for his brother while he was in trouble. It was a creative and well done storyline. There's so much to like about this book. In fact, there really is not much wrong with it to say the least. I could continue bragging about how great it is, but I'm sure you'd rather make that decision for yourself. I'll leave it on the note that the romance itself is addicting. I loved reading about them together, and let's say that some scenes are especially steamy.

Living on the streets, jumping from shelter to shelter, doesn't give seventeen-year-old Anya Anderson many options. Finally, she catches a break and scores a reporting gig on the Seconds to Juliet Tour, following around the Shy Guy, Will Fray. But Will isn't really Will—he's his twin brother, Matt. Matt's job is to satisfy Anya's journalistic curiosity, but he soon finds himself falling for her. With so many secrets between them, an actual relationship should be impossible. This was the most unique book in the Backstage Pass series. By this book, number four, I had stopped reading what the books were about and trusted that I would enjoy the story. The twist where Matt was really Will threw me. Matt, however, was a lovely band member to meet. I expected the Shy Guy's story but got something a lot different and couldn't wait to see what the last book would entail. Anya, from the beginning, wasn't like any of the other girls in the series. She had been living on her own for years and didn't know a single Seconds to Juliet song. Unlike Aimee and Daisy, she hadn't been scorned; opposite to Mia, she was sure of herself from the beginning. Her secrets and survival instincts made her journey interesting, and I wanted her to have something good and stable in her life in the form of Matt. I don't really know where to start with Matt. Winegardner did a wonderful job of creating another Backstage Pass boy to love. Their getaways to the roof and shared glances during the concerts were what any fangirl desires. I would have loved for the book to have switched back and forth between Will and Matt, to see what took place in Will's live during that time. I hope to see more of Will in the last book, as he didn't play as big a part as I thought he was going to. Since the Shy Guy wasn't really the Shy Guy was there ever really a Shy Guy? It's like a boy band paradox. A happily-ever-after doesn't seem as likely in this story, but you'll be rooting for one the entire time. There were a few slow areas, but the ending made up for it all.
