

He currently coaches in Atlanta, Georgia and other surrounding areas. With a Masterâ™s of Science degree in Sports Administration, his main focus in athletics is geared toward the development and achievement of youth athletes. His work is attributed to his strong belief that youth athletic involvement is an essential tool in the refinement of character.

I had the opportunity to read Game Changer and would highly suggest the book as a "must read" for parents. As a former DI basketball player (Auburn University) and Little League baseball Coach for nearly 20 years, I highly endorse this great piece of work. When Coaching youth baseball I had to deal with a lot of dynamics. Parents were my greatest challenge in terms of expectations of their son and the harsh remarks I heard to their child. I found many Dads to be living vicariously through their sons. Some Moms were pretty tough to deal with as well. Conservatively, I would say over 90% of the parents I dealt with had no idea that DI baseball only offers 11.7 scholarships per year and that they are not full rides unless a player is drafted out of high school in the top 3 rounds.
