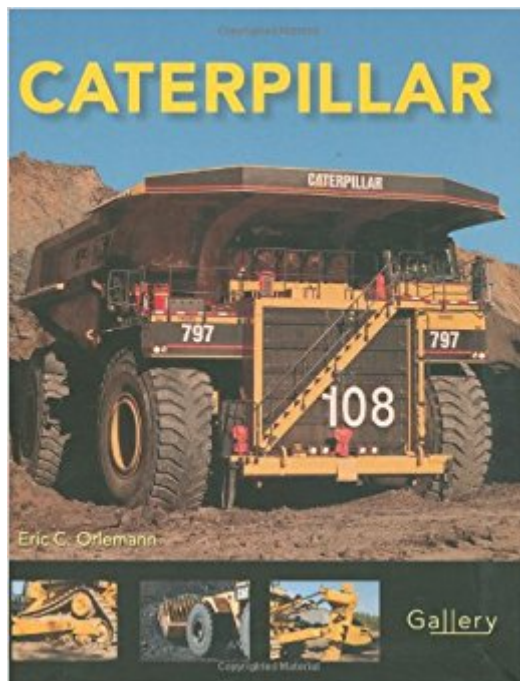

Photographs and more photographs--the best thing about this book. Since Caterpillar has manufactured so many different types of heavy earth-moving equipment, the book is divided into different sections representing different lines of tractors--the crawler, or tracklaying machines being only one of them. I particularly enjoyed reading about the very old vintage machines, since they are a hobby of mine. The narrative along with the pictures results in a concise basic history of the Caterpillar Tractor Company. I have not seen other books about Caterpillar, but I am very glad that I own this one.
