

In their second book in the *Ancient Medical Technology* series, award-winning authors Michael Woods and Mary B. Woods show how earlier cultures "did a lot with a little:" Ancient doctors did not have X-ray machines or microscopes. They did not have drugstores full of medicines. But they had as much curiosity and creativity as modern doctors and scientists. With very few tools to help them, ancient healers accomplished great things." This well-researched medical history for young people is a fascinating read, covering the ancient cultures of Egypt, Mesopotamia, India, China, Greece, Rome and the Americas, and ending with a short epilogue about medicine today. Beginning with perhaps the first known doctor, Imhotep the pyramid-builder in 2600 BC, and traveling down through history, *Ancient Medical Technology* thoroughly explores familiar subjects, and introduces some unlikely and tantalizing lesser-known information as well. Young readers will discover important contributions from Galen and Hippocrates; they will learn how many potent and effective plants available to early healers form the basis of our modern pharmacopeia. The Roman sanitation system of aqueducts, and a treasure trove of medical instruments unearthed from volcanic ash in Pompeii are among the many interesting stories presented. The reader will also encounter startling facts about ancient cataract removal, brain surgery via skull trepanation, plastic surgery to replace noses missing in battle, and ant suturing -- a procedure whereby live ants were fastened onto intestinal ruptures, "stapling" the rent tissues together until the body had time to heal itself and absorb the insect bodies. Superstitions and medical failures of earlier times are mentioned as well, for example, the medieval practice of placing dead mice on infected wounds.*Ancient Medical Technology is an excellent introduction to the history of medicine. The authors have put together a compelling book in an easy-to-access format with exciting photos and eye-catching layouts. The writing is factual and clear, with just enough "gross-out" factor to keep young readers engaged.
